Position:

Under the direction of the Anishinaabeg Immersion Coordinator, the Curricular Analyst will design a curriculum identifying, strategies, resources, to facilitate language revitalization and academic programming for students in grade JK to grade 8 in line with the Ontario Curriculum. The curriculum will be inclusive of Indigenous knowledge and land-based pedagogy.

Requirements:

- Ontario College of Teachers qualification.
- Experience in curriculum writing and development.
- Preferred previous teaching experience in a First Nation community.
- Fluent Ojibwe speaker an asset.
- Knowledgeable of Indigenous ways of knowing pedagogies.
- Will be subject to a Criminal Reference and Vulnerable Sectors Check

Responsibilities:

- Develop a curriculum that supports Indigenous knowledge, history, perspectives, methodologies and cultural practices in an immersion program.
- The curriculum will provide overall and specific expectations to teach Indigenous Knowledge and was of knowing across all subjects in grades JK-8.
- Identify professional learning resources that the Bkejwanong Kinomaagewgamig and Anishinaabeg Kinomaagewgamig can use to implement the program.
- Develop and deliver professional development in the areas of Indigenous ways of knowing and to support Indigenous perspective to teachers, administrators, staff, and community.
- Collaborate with Immersion Coordinator to develop strategies which will lead teachers to engage in initiatives that support the curriculum.
- To engage with Elders, Knowledge Keepers, Indigenous and non-Indigenous faculty and scholars, teachers, students, and other Indigenous communities and organizations, in the development of the curriculum.
- Identify best practices to support implementation of the curriculum.
- Develop a curriculum that makes use of technology in the delivery of Indigenous knowledge for students.
